#### **Under the Auspices and the Presence of the Prime Minister Dr. Rami Hamdallah and the Japanese Foreign Minister Taro Kono - Palestinian Industrial Estates and Free Zones Authority- PIEFZA Opens the Second Stage of Jericho Agro Industrial Park- JAIP, 26 December 2017**

Jericho -26 Dec. 2017- Prime Minister Dr. Rami Al-Hamdallah, together with the Japanese Foreign Minister Taro Kono, laid the cornerstone of the second stage of Jericho Agro Industrial Park- JAIP at the governorate of Jericho and the Jordan Valley with the presence of a wide participation of the Palestinian private sector, ministers, chiefs of institutions and organizations and United Nations organizations.

Jericho Agro-Industrial Park (JAIP), worth more than \$100,000,000 includes off-side and on-side infrastructure, financial support to the start-up tenants, building capacity for PIEFZA. A institution direct investment by developer and tenants. This is in addition to the land reclamation for phase one and access road from Jericho city to JAIP area.

It is worth mentioning that the second phase of JAIP will be allocated on an area of 100 dunums including 50,000 square meters for factories, approximately 8000 square meters for facilities of industrial services and 17000 square meters for logistic services. The Japanese Government is funding qualifying the site and the land settlement of the project through the United Nations Development Program- UNDP with the implementation of the Ministry of Public Works and PEIFZA. The second stage of the industrial park will provide about 1,700 direct industrial jobs and 5,000 indirect jobs.

#### **Briefing by Nickolay Mladenov, Special Coordinator for the Middle East Peace Process, to the Security Council on the situation in the Middle East – Report on UNSCR 2334 (2016), 18 December 2017**

On behalf of the Secretary-General, I devote my regular briefing on the situation in the Middle East today to presenting the fourth report on the implementation of Security Council resolution 2334 covering the period from 20 September to 18 December.

I will focus on developments on the ground in accordance with the provisions of the resolution, including on regional and international efforts to advance the peace process.

Let me note from the outset that none of the developments on the ground can be divorced from the broader context in which they are happening: uncertainties about the future of the peace process, unilateral actions that undermine the two-state solution, occupation and violence.

### **Palestinian Producer Price Index, November 2017**

Decrease in the Producer Price Index during November 2017

The overall Producer Price Index (PPI) for Palestine with its base month (December 2015=100) reached 99.48 in November 2017, as it decreased by 1.98% compared to October 2017.

Producer Price Index for locally consumed products (December 2015=100) reached 99.46 in November 2017, which indicates a decrease by 2.10% compared to October 2017.

Producer Price Index for local exported products (December 2015=100) reached 99.56 in November 2017, which indicates a decrease by 0.96% compared to October 2017.

The changes of Producer Price Index for November 2017 were traced back to changes in prices of the following major activities compared to the previous month

### **Preliminary Estimates of Quarterly National Accounts (Third Quarter 2017), Main Results, 28 December 2017**

Preliminary estimates at constant prices showed an increase of 5% in GDP in Palestine during the 3rd quarter 2017 compared to the 3rd quarter 2016, (increase 6.9% in the West Bank and decrease 0.6% in Gaza Strip compared to the 3rd quarter 2016). And it showed an increase of 3.1% in Palestine compared to the 2nd quarter 2017 at constant prices, meanwhile the base year is 2015. GDP for the 3rd quarter 2017 at constant prices was USD 2,658.5 million for the West Bank and USD 843.8 million for Gaza Strip.

Gross Domestic Product Per Capita

GDP per Capita for Palestine at constant prices was USD 745.6 during the 3rd quarter 2017, it showed an increase of 1.9% compared to the 3rd quarter 2016. As for the West Bank it was USD 968.1 at constant prices during the 3rd quarter 2017, it showed an increase by 4.6% during the 3rd quarter 2017 compared to the 3rd quarter 2016, while for Gaza Strip it was USD 432.4 during the 3rd quarter

### **Construction Cost Index (CCI), Road Cost Index (RCI), Water Networks Cost Index (WNCI) and Sewage Networks Cost Index (SNCI) in the West Bank During November 2017**

Slight decrease in the Construction Cost Index (CCI) for Residential Buildings

The Construction Cost Index (CCI) for residential buildings reached 105.07 with a slight decrease of 0.01% in the West Bank during November 2017 compared with October 2017 (base year 2013=100).

The CCI for residential buildings slightly decreased due to the decrease in rental of equipment by 0.26%. At the same time, both the prices of raw materials and labour wages remained stable during November 2017 compared with the previous month.

Slight decrease in the Construction Cost Index (CCI) for Non-residential Buildings

The Construction Cost Index (CCI) for non-residential buildings reached 105.08 with a slight decrease of 0.04% in the West Bank during November 2017 compared with October 2017 (base year 2013=100).

### **Press report of economic forecasts for 2018, 26 December 2017**

The preliminary estimates for 2017 compiled in accordance with the data available for the first three quarters of the year, and indicators for the fourth quarter 2017 used to estimate the data for that quarter. It should be noted that the data will be revised after the completion of collection of data from relevant sources.

Increase in the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) and GDP per capita during 2017

Preliminary estimates indicated an increase in GDP in Palestine by 3.2% during 2017 compared to 2016; GDP per capita has increased by 0.1% during 2017 compared to 2016.

The rise in the GDP 2017 was concentrated in the main economic activities which had a relatively higher contribution to GDP, including the construction activity, which preliminary estimates indicate its increase by 4.4% marking a total rise in the number of employees approximately 18%. The second contributor was the industry activity with a gross value added rising around 4.2% compared to 2016. The total number of employees in the industry activity also increased about 7%.
