



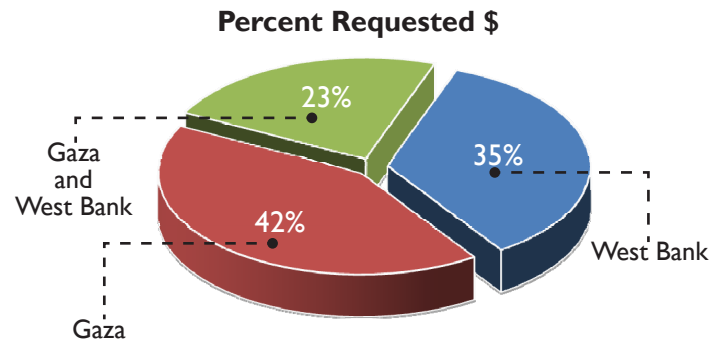
CAP 2012-2013 FACT SHEET DECEMBER 2011

1. The Consolidated Appeal Process (CAP) 2012-2013 for the occupied Palestinian territory (oPt) articulates the two-year strategy of the humanitarian community to bring assistance and protection to an estimated 1.8 million vulnerable Palestinians in Gaza, Area C of the West Bank, East Jerusalem and the Seam Zone.

2. The 2012 – 2013 CAP focuses on **two strategic objectives**: 1) **enhancing the protective environment** for the most vulnerable communities in the oPt, including the provision of equitable access to essential services; and 2) **improving the food security** of vulnerable and food insecure communities.

3. The 2012 component of the CAP includes **149 projects** in the fields of Agriculture, Cash-for-work (CFW) / Cash assistance, Education, Food, Health and Nutrition, Protection, Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) and Coordination, for a total amount of **US\$ 416.7 million**.

4. 84 of these projects are presented by international NGOs; another 17 projects are



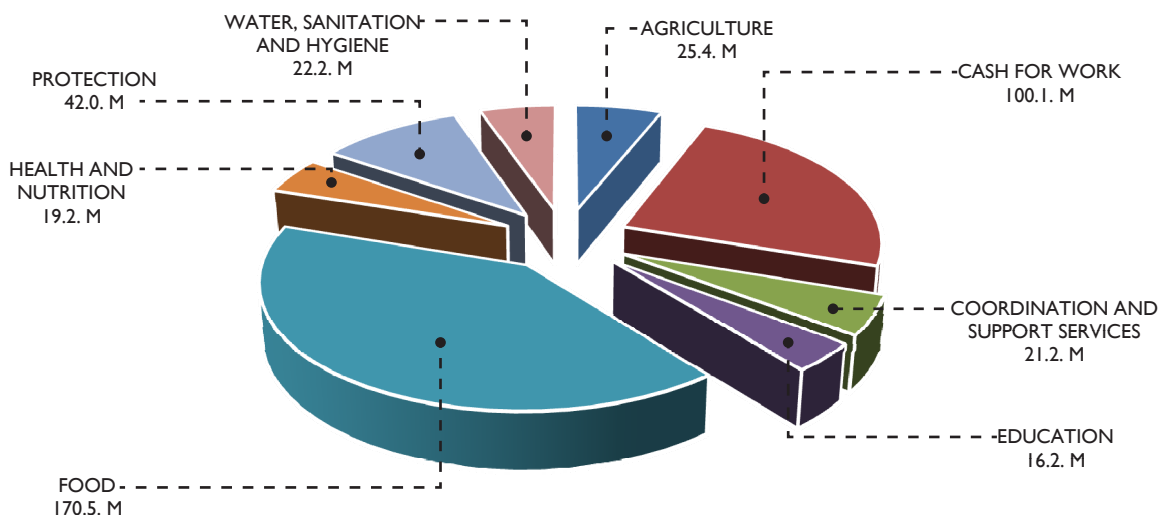
from local NGOs; the remaining 48 projects correspond to UN agencies' emergency programs.

5. The CAP 2012 – 2013 aims at addressing **the most immediate and urgent needs in the oPt, i.e. those which require an emergency response**. The CAP does not pretend to tackle the universe of needs in the oPt, many of which require recovery and longer-term solution.

6. However, the CAP 2012 - 2013 was developed **in consultation with UN development agencies and the Palestinian Authority (PA)**, particularly the Ministry of Planning

Funding Requested for CAP 2012-2013 by cluster/sector (in US \$ million)

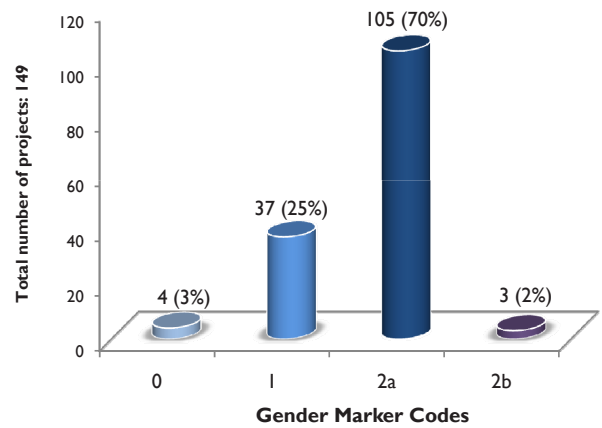
CAP 2012-2013 Total Requested Funds: US\$ 416.7 Million



and Administrative Development. This will ensure coherence and complementarity between emergency programming (reflected in the CAP) and longer terms recovery and development plans, such as the UN Medium-Term Response Plan (MTRP) and the Palestinian National Development Plan (PNDP).

- Humanitarian partners made significant efforts to ensure that the CAP 2012 – 2013 duly reflect and help address the gender dimension of the humanitarian situation in the oPt. All the 149 projects included in the CAP 2012 – 2013 were reviewed according to the **IASC Gender Marker**; **more than 70% contribute significantly to gender equality.**
